# RECRUITMENT OF DISCERNERS

I've attached an article from the current edition of *The Deacon* magazine, highlighting the challenge of recruiting younger men to discern a vocation to the diaconate. I respectfully renew my request that our community act as the best ambassadors for the diaconate, considering and approaching those men from your parish, your family, or from among your acquaintances who might be open to discerning a diaconal vocation. I always encourage interested fellows who contact me to meet up with the deacon couple(s) in their parish so that they and their wives can get a solid overview of

balancing marriage, family, employment, and formation (and later ordained ministry) from the men and women in our community who have lived, and are living, that experience. With our average age being 68, we can use new blood!

As was noted at this weekend's Convocation, we are moving to accepting a new formation class every two (2) years with the goal of establishing a more robust formation community for mutual support, quality of instruction, etc. A dearth of qualified applicants over the past couple of years has prompted us to make this move, a move that is similarly being made by other dioceses in the region. We can look at a host of different reasons for the declining number of discerners and applicants, some evident to you as you scan the pews at your parish each Sunday, and we are looking to create and maintain a strong human, pastoral, intellectual, and spiritual formation experience for our Aspirants, Candidates, their wives, and their families. It is anticipated that the next formation class will be accepted in Fall 2025, with the proviso that we have a minimum number of acceptable applicants, likely four (4), so we have time to engage with discerners and their families.

That should be enough "news" for now. Thank you for your generous service in the various ministries and apostolates in which you and your families share your time, your talents, and your faith with God's people throughout the diocese.
